Maunesha River Fish Stocking

The Maunesha River is a unique asset for Marshall and area residents, as the river provides habitat for wildlife, kayaking and canoeing opportunities, ice skating in the winter- and fishing year round!

Thanks to your generosity and support during fundraisers, the Marshall Lions Club stocked the river near Fireman's Park with over 900 fish-400 bluegills, 400 crappies, 50 bass and 50 walleye on November

Lion Bill Kuhlow

Lion Bill Kuhlow has dedicated his life to serving the community. He was one of the founders of the local Ducks Unlimited Chapter some forty years ago, and was one of the original officers in the Waterloo Gun Club. He stayed involved in both organizations and was active in the Portland community for years. "I like being involved, and I like serving the community," Lion Kuhlow says. Finally, he serves on the Sunshine Committee, which tries to spread wellwishes and sunshine on those in need of well wishes.

Lion Kuhlow plans to stay involved in the Lions for years to come, continuing his lifetime of service.




Marshall Lions Club Community Service Activity

- Why is this a good cause for the Lions to support?
- When is money needed by and to whom/what organization? (name, address, phone, email)
